

The purpose of this memorandum is to document the Performance of the Construction firm of Lawrence Brunoli Inc., following the completion of their project J145c-435. This project entailed the demolition and remodeling of the existing front entrance and administration building incorporating the construction of a new addition with special security design and specifications. This was a very complex construction project do to the security concerns and necessary precautions. This project required a well planned-out construction schedule, sensitive to the needs of the Institution.

- A. The workmanship of the project appears to be of outstanding quality. The masonry work is truly an accomplishment. All Masonry work was done in a professional manner and above local typical workmanship. All other trades provided under this contract were of similar quality with none falling below an outstanding level.
- B. Lawrence Bronoli Inc. was issued the notice to proceed July 29, 1996. Brunoli physically manned the site and began construction the very next day, July 30, 1996. Mr. Brunoli proposed a schedule that would complete the project by September 1997; four months ahead of the 638 days contractually allotted. Brunoli substantially completed September 5, 1997 as proposed. This project provided no additional funds nor incentive for Brunoli for an early completion. This professionalism is typical of Brunoli Inc Management..
- C. The Management Team of Lawrence Brunoli Inc. was very effective and sensitive to the institutional needs. The Management Team of Brunoli worked very closely with program personnel of the FCI and were very amiable with the requests of the FCI. The Management Team of Brunoli completed this project within there proposed Schedule.

- D. Lawrence Brunoli Inc. strictly adhered to the Labor Standards and would quickly correct any minor irregularity without hesitation. Brunoli supplied all Certified Payrolls, including Subcontractors in a timely fashion and ensured compliance for each tier of Sub-Contractors.
- E. The project went to completion without one single reported injury. The institution Safety Officer reported no incident(s) of violating any safety standards.

Overall Evaluation:

In my estimation this firm did an outstanding job on this project. Brunoli did not attempt to make unnecessary claim(s), change orders, provided quality material and workmanship, and completed the project four months ahead of mandatory completion with an outstanding product. When there was an emergency on site, Lawrence Brunoli was among the first to be on the scene and would attempt anything within his power to correct a problem. This evaluation is a compulation of the options of all program personnel involved.

Based on the aforementioned information I give Lawrence Brunoli Inc. a well deserved Outstanding Rating.
